

Social Studies Chapter 6

Objectives: see planned courses

Materials: activity packet, textbook, overheads of activity pages, Venn diagram posters, markers, rulers, quizzes for Lessons 2 and 4, brochure copies and rubrics, The Road to Independence rubric and blank timeline, laptops

Assessment: Chapter 6 quizzes (Lessons 2, Lesson 4), authentic assessments

Procedures:

1. "What is a community? In Chapter 6 you will learn about the history of different types of communities in America. Today we're going to learn about life as a pilgrim and as a Wampanoag Indian." Go to scholastic.com and learn about The First Thanksgiving (Voyage on the Mayflower, Daily Life, The Thanksgiving Feast slideshow). Have students take notes on a venn diagram, comparing and contrasting the daily life of the Pilgrims and the Wampanoag. Share some of the similarities and differences after visiting the web site.

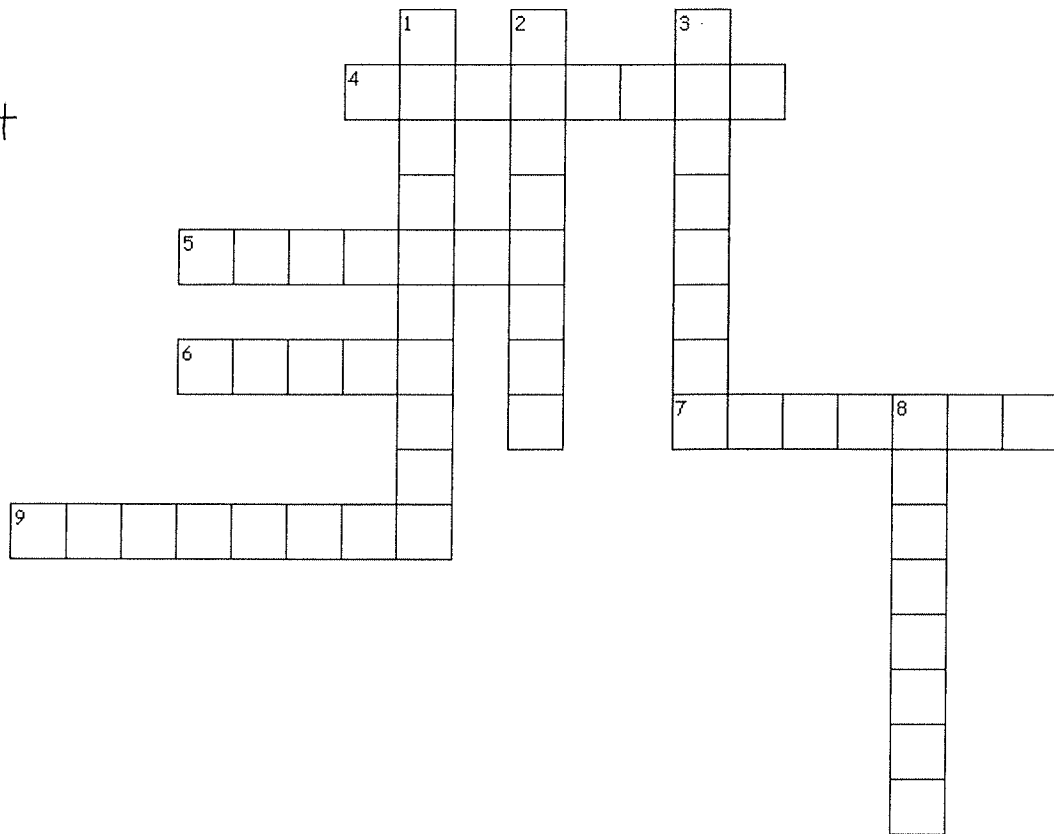
